



Al Gore's Climate Leadership Program

The Climate Reality Project (TCRP)



Former U.S. Vice President and Nobel Laureate Al Gore founded the Climate Reality Project in 2006. As a program of the **Alliance for Climate Protection**, TCRP's mission is to educate the public about the harmful effects of climate change and to work toward solutions at a grassroots level worldwide.

The Climate Reality Project has branches in 10 countries and presence in more than 100 countries. Currently, The Climate Reality Project has trained more than 10,000 diverse and dedicated volunteers internationally called **Climate Leaders** representing 135 countries. The Climate Leaders have delivered 70,000 presentations and have reached a combined global audience of more than 7.3 million.

At COP 21 Climate Reality Project joined with partners throughout the climate community – including Avaaz, 350.org, the Sierra Club, Guardians of the Earth, CAN International, Greenpeace, and many more – to bring over 6.2 million people together to demand action in Paris, with over **2 million of those being Climate Reality supporters**. The world was watching these negotiations in a way it never had before – and it showed.

The Climate Reality Project India (TCRP-I)



The Climate Reality Project India an independent chapter of The Climate Reality Project (International) was established in March 2008 with the help of Al Gore and Dr. R K Pachauri. In 2009 it was incorporated as a trust in Mumbai. The India branch looks after more than 450 trained Climate Leaders and more than 900 volunteers spread all over the country.

This year apart from continuing to expand our climate change presentations, our agenda will include developing new content on Indian solutions, developing a rural awareness program and working with teachers to take the message deeper into classrooms.

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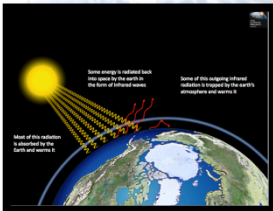
Teacher Training Program (TTP)



The Teacher Training Program is our flagship program running successfully since 2009. We have trained more than 2000 teachers from over 542 schools, including Mayo, Sanskriti, Sriram, Vasant Valley, Modern, Banyan Tree, Delhi Public School, St Mary's School, Bal Bharati School, Ahlcon International School among others across India. We are also working with Delhi government, Himachal government and Mumbai government respectively to train teachers.

We organized a "High Impact Cluster Teacher Training Workshop" in Chandigarh on 5th June 2015 – World Environment Day. There were 180 teachers trained in this workshop. We also organized a "High Impact Teacher Training Cluster Workshop" in Mumbai on 14th – 15th – 16th of July 2015. There were 180 teachers trained in this workshop as well. The TTP inculcates giving a presentation that is divided into science of climate change, impacts of climate change and solutions to climate change.
